Position Title: Primary Care Psychologist

Licensed psychologists (or license-eligible) and psychologist residents are sought to join an innovative, rapidly growing practice in the field of integrated behavioral health in Eugene, Oregon. Strong Integrated Behavioral Health provides team-based, integrated care onsite at primary care and specialty medical clinics, as well as coordinated outpatient psychotherapy and psychological assessment services for individuals, couples, children, teens, and families at our stand-alone behavioral health clinic at 66 Club Road in Eugene.

The Primary Care Psychologist works as a primary care team member and delivers brief, consultation-based services to patients and primary care providers using an integrated care model. Responsibilities include:

- Introduce patients to role of psychologists in the integrated care setting using the biopsychosocial model.
- Utilize appropriate assessment tools including PHQ-9, SBIRT and others and uses results to guide treatment plan.
- Identify referral problem and provide evidence-based interventions appropriate for the primary care setting.
- Coordinate care with primary care team members, including physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurse care managers, registered dietitians, pharmacists, and community resources.
- Provide group interventions for patients in primary care including chronic pain management, stress management, depression/anxiety, smoking cessation, weight loss and others utilizing CBT, DBT, ACT, Mindfulness-based approaches and other evidence-based approaches.
- Serve as a consultant on behavioral health issues to members of the primary care team both informally and through developing and presenting educational lectures and written materials to the team members.

Qualifications:

- Licensure (or license-eligible) in Oregon as a psychologist or as a psychologist resident.
- Interest in and demonstrated ability to work as part of an integrated team of healthcare professionals including medical providers, other behavioral health providers, care managers, and community partners, to provide coordinated care to clients with a wide range of psychological needs.
- Excellent communication skills as evidenced by the ability to establish collaborative relationships with clients and other professionals.
- Training and experience in the areas of psychological assessment and report writing is preferred.
- Ability to effectively deliver psychotherapeutic interventions that are evidence-based and can be applied to a wide range of clients.
- Demonstrated commitment to providing culturally competent services, with an ongoing commitment to training and development in this area.
- Training and experience delivering psychotherapeutic services to clients with complex medical issues and a wide range of behavioral health concerns.
- Demonstrated ability to accurately document interventions, including charting on clinical services, completing written psychological reports, and other professional documentation.
- Uphold the ethics codes of the American Psychological Association, the Oregon Revised Statutes and the Oregon Administrative Rules overseeing the practice of the provider's discipline.
- Complete activities required to maintain a license to practice psychology in the State of Oregon in good standing.
